CODE OF CONDUCT



Dear Parents/ Guardians

The aim of this booklet is to establish appropriate behavioural guidelines for the pupils of Sandton School Group and their parents.

We aim to build up the self-esteem of each and every one of our pupils and to make sure they feel that they are an integral part of the Sandton School Group community.

Please read this booklet to your child/ren so they have a better understanding of what we expect from them.

GENERAL EXPECTATIONS FOR A SANDTON SCHOOL GROUP PUPIL:

GENERAL BEHAVIOUR

- Be polite and have good manners at all times
- Greet all adults you meet at school
- Be kind and considerate – do not upset any fellow peers
- Remember your table manners when having lunch
- Be honest – own up if you have done something wrong
- Foul language will not be tolerated
- Do not litter on the school premises
- Arrive at school on time
- Be at school everyday
- Remember to wear your hat when you are outside during playtime
- Bring healthy food to school
- Chewing gum is prohibited at school
- Make sure you are dressed neatly according to the school dress code
- No cell phones or electronic equipment to be brought to school without prior permission and handed in at reception upon entering the school





BEHAVIOUR IN CLASS:

- Look after your belongings and that of others
- Have respect for the school property
- Greet your teachers everyday
- Greet other teachers and adults in the school
- Listen to your teachers' instructions and do what is asked

BULLYING:

- We do not want bullies at school
- Do not tease your friends, call them names or gang up on someone
- Keep your hands and feet to yourself
- Your teacher is always there to help you, if you have a problem, go straight to your teacher

ATTITUDE TOWARDS THE TEACHERS:

- Respect teachers as professionals who value your children and put their needs first
- Encourage your children to respect their teachers property
- Don't bring toys to school because they might get lost or broken
- Don't leave your belongings lying around because the school will not take responsibility
- Don't take things that do not belong to you
- Look after your uniform and all of your belongings
- Make sure all your belongings are clearly marked

SPORTS AND EXTRAS:

- Participation in a sport and in extra murals is required
- Be a good sport
- Don't get upset when you lose a game
- Congratulate your peers when they win uniform
- Pupils must carry their own bags to and from school
- Arrive at school looking smart and in the correct uniform
- Remember to have your shirt tucked in at all times when you are wearing your school uniform
- Only school uniform may be worn at school
- Shirt collar to be folded over blazer collar or jersey when not wearing a tie
- Girls to wear bashers at all times and boys to wear the correct cap according to the dress code



WORK WITH THE SCHOOL:



- Work with the school rather than against it
- Make sure your child is dressed neatly in public places
- Avoid car park gossip and rather talk to the teacher or head of department
- Deal openly with problems on the right level
- Help your child to be proud of his school and uniform
- Do not discipline someone else's child on the property, let the teacher deal with any issues
- Support the teacher when your child is disciplined
- Make your children aware of the different cultures and religions and teach them to respect everyone even though they are different from your own

RAISING YOUR CHILDREN:

- Encourage children to do things for themselves
- Encourage a sense of order and routine in your child
- Spend time with your child – read and communicate with them
- Play with your child
- Involve your child in household chores as these will develop motor skills, confidence, independence and social cooperation
- Be actively involved in your child's daily lives but avoid being 'helicopter parents' that hover around their children all the time
- Encourage an active involvement in gross motor skills

DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURE (A NOTE TO PARENTS)

The aim of the disciplinary procedure is to illustrate to offenders that their behaviour has been inappropriate and that the school has a higher expectation of them.

Reward for good behaviour is regarded as a more valuable and constructive way to encourage children as opposed to punishment.



THE DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURE WE FOLLOW:

- The teacher speaks kindly but sternly to the children
- Children who have behaved badly are put into "time out" which is a withdrawal from an activity – the child is then expected to apologise for their bad behaviour
- For very bad behaviour, the teachers send the children to be reprimanded by the head of department or Head of school – they will then give them a stern talking to
- If behaviour persists, the teacher will call the parent in for a chat
- We use a merit and demerit system, please familiarise yourself and your children with it

We hope this clarifies what is expected of the children. Please support us in our efforts to maintain a high level of values and ethos within Sandton School Group.

UNIFORM ETIQUETTE

Sandton School Group: Code of Conduct – Uniform and Grooming

At Sandton School Group, a high standard of uniform and personal grooming is essential in promoting discipline, school pride, and unity. All learners are expected to uphold these standards consistently, both on and off school premises.

1. Uniform Expectations

- Learners must wear the full, correct school uniform at all times.
- Blazers are compulsory in public and at all formal school functions.
- The official school fleece top is not part of the summer uniform, except for Grade R learners.
- Long, sloppy jerseys are not permitted under any circumstances.

2. Hats and Headwear

- Hats are to be worn in public and at all formal school functions.
- White basher hats must be kept clean and are not to be worn in rainy weather – they should be brought to school in a plastic bag when rain is expected.
- Foundation Phase learners are required to wear the official blue floppy sun hat during break and sports activities.
- Intermediate and Senior Phase boys must wear the blue peak cap during break and sports activities.
- Girls must wear their white basher hats during break.

3. Hair and Grooming

- Hair must be clean, neat, and tidy at all times.
- Long hair must be tied back neatly using regulation clips, hair bands, or scrunchies in school colours.
- Girls may not colour, tint, or streak their hair.
- Braids must match the learner's natural hair colour.
- Hairstyles must accommodate the wearing of school hats or caps.
- Nails must be clean, short, and free of nail varnish.
- Make-up is strictly prohibited for all learners.

4. Jewellery and Accessories

- Only official school badges may be worn on the left lapel of the blazer.
- Learners may wear a gold, silver, black, brown, or navy wristwatch.
- Girls may wear one pair of small gold or silver sleepers or plain gold studs (without stones) in their earlobes.
- No other jewellery is permitted.
- Boys are not allowed to wear earrings.

5. Grooming for Boys

- Hair must be neat and cut short at all times.
- Hair must not hang over the eyes or face.

6. Personal Belongings

- All personal items and uniform pieces must be clearly marked with the learner's name on the inside.
- The school does not accept responsibility for lost valuables or unmarked items

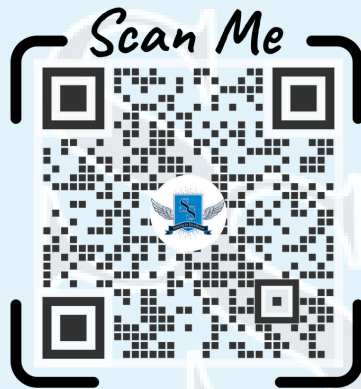


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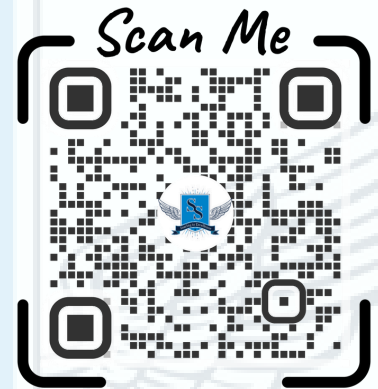
